<i>Pseudacris brachyphona</i>	Mountain Chorus Frog	RD, S, SS, TP; not associated with [large] streams, ponds, or lakes (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Pseudacris brimleyi</i>	Brimley's Chorus Frog	TP, SW
<i>Pseudacris c. crucifer</i>	Northern Spring Peeper	L, MA, ME, P, RD, SS, SW, TP
<i>Pseudacris feriarum</i>	Upland Chorus Frog	L, MA, ME, P, RD, TP, SW (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Pseudacris feriarum kalmi</i>	New Jersey Chorus Frog	L, MA, ME, P, RD, TP, SW (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Pseudacris ocularis</i>	Little Grass Frog	L, MA, P, TP, SW

<i>Rana catesbeiana</i>	American Bullfrog	L, P, R, RD, LS, SS, SW, TP; require permanent waters (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Rana clamitans melanota</i>	Northern Green Frog	H, P, LS, SS, R, SW, TP
<i>Rana palustris</i>	Pickerel Frog	L, MA, P, LS, SS, R, SW, TP (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Rana pipiens</i>	Northern Leopard Frog	L, SS, MA, SW, P (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Rana septentrionalis</i>	Mink Frog	L, P, LS, R (permanent or semipermanent waters); sometimes uses TP, SS, RD (Hulse et al., 2001)
<i>Rana sphenocephala</i>	Southern Leopard Frog	L, MA, P, RD, SW
<i>Rana sylvatica</i>	Wood Frog	P, RD, SS, SW, TP (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Rana virgatipes</i>	Carpenter Frog	SS, SW, MA (Hulse et al. 2001)

<i>Gastrophryne carolinensis</i>	Eastern Narrow-mouthed Toad	P, SW, TP
