<i>Rana palustris</i>	Pickerel Frog	N - generalist carnivores (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Rana pipiens</i>	Northern Leopard Frog	N - generalist carnivores (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Rana septentrionalis</i>	Mink Frog	N - generalist carnivores (Hulse et al. 2001)
