<i>Regina r. rigida</i>	Glossy Crayfish Snake	LS, MA, P, SW
<i>Regina septemvittata</i>	Queen Snake	L, LS, P, RD, SS
<i>Storeria d. dekayi</i>	Northern Brown Snake	NA
<i>Storeria o. occipitomaculata</i>	Northern Red-bellied Snake	NA
<i>Tantilla coronata</i>	Southeastern Crowned Snake	NA
<i>Thamnophis brachystoma</i>	Short-headed Garter Snake	usually within a few 100 m of SS, LS, R (Hulse et al. 2001)
<i>Thamnophis s. sauritus</i>	Common Ribbon Snake	found near L, LS, MA, ME, P, RD, SW
<i>Thamnophis sauritis septentrionalis</i>	Northern Ribbon Snake	found near L, LS, MA, ME, P, RD, SW
<i>Thamnophis sirtalis pallidulus</i>	Maritime Garter Snake	L, LS, MA, P, R
<i>Thamnophis s. sirtalis</i>	Eastern Garter Snake	L, LS, MA, P, R
